For TCM's 10-City *Road to Hollywood* Tour**

**Tour of Local Screenings Serves as Build-Up to 2013 TCM Classic Film Festival;  
Free Tickets to be Available at <http://tcm.com/roadtohollywood>**

Turner Classic Movies (TCM) has added six legendary stars and seven cities to this year's *Road to Hollywood*, the nationwide tour of free screenings leading up to the **2013 TCM Classic Film Festival** in Hollywood. **Angie Dickinson, Jane Powell, Mitzi Gaynor, Robert Wagner** and **Tippi Hedren** are set to make appearances during the 10-city tour, which has added February events in **Dallas** and **Washington, D.C.**; March events in **Boston** and **Chicago**; and April events in **San Francisco** and **Albuquerque**.

Tickets are now available for the next *Road to Hollywood* events, a screening of the classic western *Rio Bravo* (1959) starring the legendary **Angie Dickinson**, who along with TCM Host **Ben Mankiewicz** will be on hand to introduce the film on **Tuesday, Feb. 19** at the Historic Texas Theater in Dallas. Also, available are tickets to the screening of Fritz Lang's visionary sci-fi classic *Metropolis* (1927) set for **Thursday, Feb. 21**, at the AFI Silver Theatre in Silver Springs, Md. The film will be introduced by TCM host **Ben Mankiewicz** and will feature an original score performed live by the highly innovative **Alloy Orchestra**. In addition to *Rio Bravo* and *Metropolis*, upcoming screenings on the *Road to Hollywood* tour include *Royal Wedding* (1951), *South Pacific* (1958), *The Pink Panther* (1964) and *Marnie* (1964). Hosting duties for the screenings will be shared by Mankiewicz, TCM host **Robert Osborne** and film historian and author **Leonard Maltin**. A complete schedule of events is included below.

TCM's *Road to Hollywood* tour serves as a prelude to the **2013 TCM Classic Film Festival**, taking place April 25-28, 2013, in Hollywood. TCM kicked off the latest *Road to Hollywood* tour in October with a screening of *Forbidden Planet* (1956) at the Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex in Orlando. The film was introduced live from the International Space Station by Commander Suni Williams. *Road to Hollywood* continued in November with a screening of *On the Waterfront* (1954), featuring a live appearance by Oscar® winner Eva Marie Saint. And in January, Liza Minnelli, Joel Grey, Michael York and Marisa Berenson joined TCM host Robert Osborne to introduce the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary restoration of *Cabaret* (1972) at New York City's famous Ziegfeld Theatre, where the film first premiered.

## About the 2013 TCM Classic Film Festival

The TCM Classic Film Festival launched in spring 2010 and has established itself as a destination event. Each year, the festival welcomes 25,000 movie fans from around the globe to enjoy more than a hundred screenings and events.

This year's TCM Classic Film Festival will take place **Thursday, April 25 – Sunday, April 28**. After opening with a gala presentation of the brand new restoration of the musical classic *Funny Girl* (1968), the festival will feature appearances by **Jane Fonda**, who will have her hand and footprints enshrined at the TCL Chinese Theatre prior to a screening of *On Golden Pond* (1981); **Tippi Hedren**, who will be on hand for a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary screening of the Alfred Hitchcock classic *The Birds* (1963); and documentary filmmaker **Albert Maysles** whose extraordinary career will be celebrated with presentations of his films *Gimme Shelter* (1970) and *Salesman* (1968). The festival lineup will also celebrate *Bugs Bunny's 75<sup>th</sup> Birthday*, with a collection of shorts curated and presented by **Leonard Maltin** and **Jerry Beck**. And silent film composer Carl Davis will be on hand to conduct his score for the classic *It* (1927). Among the many restorations set to premiere at the festival are *The Big Parade* (1925), *The General* (1926), *Giant* (1956) and *The Great Escape* (1963), *Badlands* (1973) and *Scarecrow* (1973), along with many more.

TCM host and film historian **Robert Osborne** serves as official host of the 2013 TCM Classic Film Festival, with TCM's **Ben Mankiewicz** also introducing films and events during the festival. The **Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel**, which has a longstanding role in movie history and was the site of the first Oscars® ceremony, will once again serve as the official hotel for the festival, as well as a central gathering point for attendees. Screenings and events will also be

held at the **TCL Chinese Theatre**, the **Chinese 6 Theatres** and the **Egyptian Theatre**. The Hollywood Roosevelt will also offer special rates for festival attendees.

***Cinematic Journeys: Travel in the Movies***, the theme for the 2013 TCM Classic Film Festival, will explore how movies can carry viewers beyond their hometowns to distant or imaginary locales, where they can be transformed by great storytelling. Often, the mode of travel provides the filmic inspiration, whether it's planes, trains, or automobiles. At other times, the trip itself serves as the central narrative, as in the case of many "road movies." With Hollywood as the starting point, TCM's cinematic excursion will take festival attendees on a fascinating journey to worlds both familiar and new.

The roster of official partners for the fourth-annual celebration includes **Verizon**, the official lead partner; **Citi**, the official card of the festival; **Porsche**, the official automobile of the festival; **Delta Air Lines**, the official Airline of the festival; **Vanity Fair**, a festival partner and co-presenter of the opening-night after party; and **Bonhams**, a festival partner that will provide film-related exhibit items, conduct an on-site valuation session for passholders and co-present a slate of British films as part of the festival lineup.
